

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. If I have been out of school for a number of years or have a college degree, am I still required to have an ACT score?**
- A. Yes, **all** applicants must have an ACT score to be considered for acceptance into the school.

- Q. If I took the ACT exam years ago, will that be sufficient?**
- A. Yes, but a more current test score usually demonstrates a higher score.
-
- Q. When I take the ACT exam, can I opt out of the writing portion of the exam?**
- A. Yes you may.
-
- Q. Do you participate with MI Works (No worker left behind program)?**
- A. Yes, we do participate with MI Works. Please apply to MI Works to check to see if you meet their requirements.

- Q. What are the hours each day and how many days a week do I have to attend?**
- A. The hours are predominantly 7:30 AM – 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday with some Saturday clinical rotations.

- Q. How long is the program?**
- A. The program consists of 6 - 16 week semesters with a 9 day break between semesters for a total of 24 months.

- Q. Do you provide financial aid or participate with FAFSA?**
- A. We do not offer any financial aide. If accepted the Program Director will give you a letter proving you are a full-time student for deferment of your previous student loans.

Q. Will the contact hours I receive after graduation transfer to a University or other colleges?

A. The program is a certificate program. The contact hours you receive do transfer to some universities and colleges in the area.

Q. When I graduate from your program, am I guaranteed a position within the DMC?

A. If there are positions open at any of the DMC hospitals, the Sinai-Grace graduates may apply, but there is no guarantee of a position.

Q. My college credits were completed more than 5 years ago, would these credits be accepted for prerequisites?

A. Yes, but candidates that have taken the credits within the past 5 years may have a better opportunity of acceptance into the school of radiology due to current algebra, science, and computer skills.
